Chelmsley Wood has an area of 1,570 acres of which approximately 825 acres are used for residential purposes. There are 14,300 dwellings on the estate including 1,100 dwellings built by housing associations. Development commenced in 1966 and was completed in 1971. The municipal dwellings are under the control of this City's Housing Committee and the management of the properties is undertaken by the Committee's Chelmsley Wood Area Housing Centre which is situated in the town centre. The Area Housing Centre was the first to be provided by the Housing Committee and as a result of its success a second Centre has been opened in the City and further centres are planned.

1100 hours:

Arrive at the site of the National Exhibition Centre, Bickenhill, where the party will be met by Mr. R. C. Booth, the Director of the Birmingham Chamber of Commerce and Industry and representatives of National Exhibition Centre Limited, following which the party will be conducted around the site.

The National Exhibition Centre, which will comprise one million square feet of covered accommodation, is designed to provide the country with an integrated purpose-built exhibition and conference complex with all necessary ancillary facilities.

The scheme is financed partly by Government Grant (£1.5m.) with Birmingham Corporation raising the balance required of £15.7m. Site work began in January 1973 and completion date for the exhibition halls according to critical path analysis is November 1975; the opening date is set for January 1976.

The National Exhibition Centre Limited (a non-profit distributing company whose board consists of four representatives from each of the City of Birmingham and the Birmingham Chamber of Commerce and Industry) has been appointed by the City as their agents to construct and run the National Exhibition Centre until 31st December, 1980.

At the conclusion of the tour, the party will be taken by coach to the Chamber of Commerce and Industry for lunch which will be given on behalf of the Chamber by Mr. L. Friedman, Chairman of the East Europe Export Committee.

The water is filtered and treated with lime, chlorine and sodium silicofluoride before it enters the 72 mile long aqueduct which carries it the whole distance to Birmingham by gravity.
